**Organization Summary:**

This organization is located in the Toronto and East York Community Council District and works with local residents. Services include social, recreation and education programs for low income residents of all ages. Services for people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness include Heyworth House, a 70-bed shelter for men and women; the Schoolhouse, a 55-bed shelter for homeless men; and Labour Link, an employment program that provides links to temporary employment opportunities; and housing supports.

**Dixon SDL**

The project's main office is located in Ward 28. This project provides support services to women and men living at six sites operated by Dixon Neighbourhood Homes in multiple wards in the Toronto and East York Community Council District to assist them to maintain their housing.

Support services include conflict mediation; community development; crisis intervention; referrals regarding income supports, employment and health care; and assistance with budgeting, homemaking, community living and personal care. In 2008, 94 clients were assisted through this project. It is delivered by a staff of 2.6 FTEs.

**Organization Summary:**

This organization is located in the Toronto and East York Community Council District and provides supports to single women and men at 63 sites to help them to maintain their housing. Tenants include formerly homeless people. Supports and services for tenants include life skills training, advocacy, mediation, problem solving, and referrals to community resources.

**Project(s) Description(s):**

**Ecuhome SDL**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010      End: 31-Dec-2010)

The project's main office is located in Ward 20. This project provides support services to single women and men living in 475 units at 63 sites managed by Ecuhome Corporation in multiple wards across the City to assist them to maintain their housing.

Support services include conflict mediation; community development; crisis intervention; referrals regarding income supports, employment and health care; and assistance with budgeting, homemaking, community living and personal care. In 2008, 595 clients were assisted through this project. It is delivered by a staff of 20.1 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.

**Operation Springboard**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010      End: 31-Dec-2010)

The project is located in Ward 27. This project provides support services to 60 single men residing at 76 Pembroke Street who require significant ongoing supports to maintain their housing.

**Trellis Gardens**

(Start: 15-Dec-2009      End: 31-Dec-2010)

The project is located in Ward 15. This project provides support services at a 24 unit family building at 647-657 Lawrence Avenue West. Support services are provided to tenants who had previously lived in shelters, and require significant ongoing supports to maintain their housing.

**Two Murray**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010      End: 31-Dec-2010)

The project is located in Ward 20. This project provides support services to single women and men living at 2 Murray Street who require significant ongoing supports to maintain their housing.

**Organization Summary:**

This organization is located in the Toronto and East York Community Council District and works with people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Services include: Women's Hostel, a 40-bed shelter for homeless women; Bethlehem United Shelter, a 60-bed shelter for homeless men and women; 194 units of shared housing for chronically homeless adults; an employment training and resource centre; a literacy program; a meal program and a day program for women.

**Project(s) Description(s):**

**SDL at 319 Dundas St. East**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010 End: 31-Dec-2010)

The project's main office is located in Ward 28. This project provides support services to women previously residing at Cornerstone Women's Residence and now living at All Saints Church Homes for Tomorrow Society (ASCHFTS) at 319 Dundas St. East, to assist them to maintain their housing. The project also provides personal supports and community development services to other tenants residing at 319 Dundas St. East.

Support services include conflict mediation; community development; crisis intervention; referrals regarding income supports, employment and health care; and assistance with budgeting, homemaking, community living and personal care. In 2008, 16 clients were provided intensive supports and 10 were provided lower level supports. This project is delivered by a staff of 2.2 FTEs.

Fred Victor Centre was selected as service provider at this site through a competitive process in 2006.

In 2008, 1,087 clients were assisted through this project. It is delivered by a staff of 10.0 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.

In 2008, 48 clients were assisted through this project. It is delivered by a staff of 4.5 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.
