**Organization Summary:**

This organization is located in the Toronto & East York Community Council District and works with individuals and families, gays, lesbians, bisexuals, transexual and transgendered people. Services include cultural, social and recreation programs for all ages. Services for people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness include a weekly drop-in and the Meal Trans program.

**Project(s) Description(s):**

**Sunday & Meal Trans Drop-In**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010      End: 31-Dec-2010)

This project is located in Ward 27 and primarily serves clients from the ward and adjacent wards. It provides a drop-in one day per week for people who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness and a meal program one day per week for homeless transexual and transgendered people. Services include peer support, information, referrals to shelter/housing, and other resources, a weekly legal clinic, and other programs designed to build informal support networks that assist people to access or maintain housing. Hours of operation are increased during the winter. In 2008, 98 clients were assisted by this project on an average day. The project is delivered by a staff of 3.9 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.

**Organization Summary:**

This organization is located in the Scarborough Community Council District and works with local residents. Services include information and referrals, emergency food bank, cooking club, parenting workshops, legal and budget counselling, and food security program. Services for homeless people and people at risk of homelessness include drop-in, street outreach and cooking workshops.

**Project(s) Description(s):**

**Drop-in and Meal Program**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010      End: 31-Dec-2010)

This project is located in Ward 40 and serves people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness in the Scarborough Community Council District, including in priority neighbourhoods. Drop-in services are provided at four sites. Services include a weekly hot lunch and drop-in at Knox Presbyterian Church in northwest Scarborough and a weekly drop-in at Agincourt Community Services Association. Each drop-in provides counselling, information and referral services. The Agincourt Community Services site also provides a community kitchen and classes based on cooking healthy on a budget for drop-in clients who wish to increase their independence in the kitchen and acquire skills they will need to maintain permanent housing. In 2008, 75 clients were assisted by this project on an average day. The project is delivered by a staff of 1.2 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.

**Increased Hours of Service**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010      End: 31-Dec-2010)

This project will provide increased hours of basic service in areas with service gaps, outside the central core of the City. This includes year-round services on weekdays, weekends, and statutory holidays, including during extreme weather conditions in winter and summer.

**Increased Staffing**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010      End: 31-Dec-2010)

This drop-in is located in Ward 40 and serves people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness in the Scarborough Community Council District, including in priority neighbourhoods. Drop-in services are provided at four sites. With funding for increased staffing, this project will be better able to provide basic services to clients, such as a safe place, shelter from the elements, meals/refreshments, washrooms, telephones, information and referrals, and limited individual supports.

This organization is located in the Toronto and East York Community Council District and works with people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Services include: Women's Hostel, a 40-bed shelter for homeless women; Bethlehem United Shelter, a 60-bed shelter for homeless men and women; 194 units of shared housing for chronically homeless adults; an employment training and resource centre; a literacy program; a meal program and a day program for women.

**Project(s) Description(s):**

**Community Food Access Program**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010 End: 31-Dec-2010)

This project is located in Ward 28 and serves people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness in the ward. A nutritious meal program is provided for a minimal fee five mornings per week at the main Fred Victor Centre site. This service provides a safe location for housing workers and case managers to meet with their clients and builds informal support networks that enable people to access and maintain housing. Volunteer opportunities in the program give homeless people access to training. In 2008, 316 clients were assisted by this project on an average day. It is delivered by a staff of 3.1 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.

**RPCHC Women's Project**

This project is located in Ward 28 and primarily serves women who are homeless or at-risk of homelessness from the ward and adjacent wards. It is linked to the Fred Victor Centre's Women's Day Program at the Adelaide Resource Centre for Women and delivered in partnership with Regent Park Community Health Centre. The project helps to build informal social support networks through a variety of housing, education and employment services that enable women to get and maintain their housing. In 2008, 32 clients were assisted by this project on an average day. It is delivered by a staff of 2.4 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.

**Women's Day Program**

(Start: 01-Jan-2010 End: 31-Dec-2010)

This project is located in Ward 28 and serves homeless and marginally housed women from the Toronto and East York Community Council District. The drop-in services are provided at the Adelaide Resource Centre for Women five days per week. Services include individual support, crisis intervention, group activities, information and referrals to other services, and assistance with accessing appropriate housing. In 2008, 110 clients were assisted by this project on an average day. The project is delivered by a staff of 3.0 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.

A drop-in program five days per week provides counselling, access to food and clothing, referrals to other resources, and programs designed to build informal support networks that assist youth to access or maintain housing. In 2008, 25 clients were assisted by this project on an average day. The project is delivered by a staff of 0.5 FTEs and funded by multiple sources which include the City.
